Focus Group Meetings/ Discussions	The aim of a focus group is to bring together stakeholders with the same interests or common characteristics into a meeting to discuss specific topics or project components in a focused manner. For example, focus group methods may be used to explore issues that are relevant to specific groups
Formal meetings	These meetings are focused on identifying and discussing specific stakeholder concerns and disclosing project information. Participation in these meetings will be influenced by the issues under consideration and should include adequate representation of women as well as other marginalized.
One –on one interview	The interviews will aim to give chance to individuals to air concerns about the project. Such meetings should be available to women as well as vulnerable and vulnerable individuals in a manner that would facilitate their attendance
