- 3. Provide spectacles to correct refractive error of those suffering from low-vision.
- 4. Facilitating cataract surgeries through modern techniques.

- People get registered first before going to the doctor
- People going on screening
- Patients get medical treatment and get glasses
- Patients undergoing eye surgery
- Patients get an awareness of eye protection

- 2. What if we can do heavy work and stoop?
- 3. How long do we use medicine?
- 4. How long do we wear glasses?
- 5. Can they apply oil on their face?
- 6. Is the medicine applied to only one eye?
