1. BACKGROUND

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Lalji Foundation is a Non-Government Organization registered and operating in Tanzania with registration number **00NGO/R/4407**. The foundation, founded by the Lalji family of Tanzania, is a testament to our commitment to give back to the community and enhance the quality of life for all. With a deep-rooted belief in the power of collective progress, we dedicate ourselves to the development of an inclusive human society. Our Foundation aims to help people in different groups, especially those with special needs.

The primary aim of the Foundation is to work towards the development of an inclusive human society and improve the quality of their lives by empowering people to be self-sufficient economically using education, skills development and financial assistance

2. OBJECTIVES

- To ensure orphans wear the same new clothing as other students
- Prevent distractions caused by "fashion clothes" to enhance focus in classrooms.
- Improve the education sector by providing essential items for school-going children.
- Provide bags to keep notebooks and other educational materials organized.
- Inspire and motivate other sponsors to support orphans and similar causes.

The main sponsor for this project was LALJI FOUNDATION, which contributed **30,055,200/= million Shillings** to support **400 children**. A special event was held on **9th January 2025** in **Dar es Salaam** to distribute the items.

The Chief Guest was Hon Deputy Minister of Community Development, Gender and Special Groups Mwanaidi Ali Khamis at Makumbusho ya Taifa Dar es Salaam region.

The event was conducted under the slogan: **"HAKI SAWA KWA WATOTO WOTE"** which means **"equal rights for all children"**

Mwanaidi Ali Khamis Hon Deputy Minister of Community Development, Gender and Special Groups emphasized to all students to focus on their education. The government puts a lot of effort to safeguard the interests of children and strengthen social services in the country. She commended the work carried out by Lalji Foundation to support these orphans for their educational needs.

Imtiaz Lalji, Chairman of the Lalji Foundation said that the goal is to help these orphans by providing them uniforms and school kits to enable them to pursue their education goals.

Fatema Lalji, the Hon Secretary of LALJI FOUNDATION, spoke about the different projects and activities carried out by the Foundation in the year 2024. These activities included Eye camps and medical Camps in Kasulu, Songea and Kigamboni. The Foundation donated prosthetics at CCBRT Hospital. School desks were donated at Kisarawe schools. And other projects of boreholes, economic empowerment and food rations for orphans





From orphanages to opportunities: Foundation delivers school supplies

THE importance of a loving, supportive family environment for children is often emphasised as the ideal scenario for their development. However, not every child is so fortunate. This reality is especially poignant in orphanages, where children, for reasons ranging from loss of parents to abandonment or social challenges, live in institutional care.

While orphanages strive to provide basic needs, the broader community—including individuals, institutions and organisations—must play a crucial role in ensuring that these children have access to resources that can help them achieve their full potential. Here, a recent initiative by the Laji Foundation underscores this point in a powerful and impactful way.

On a bright, hopeful day in Dar es Salaam, the Laji Foundation made a significant contribution to nine orphanage homes, providing essential school supplies, including uniforms, bags, shoes and socks, for a total of 400 children. The foundation's efforts were part of a broader initiative to support the education of children in orphanage homes, a gesture that did not just meet immediate needs, but also highlighted the importance of giving children in these institutions the tools they need to build a brighter future.

At the donation ceremony, which drew attention from both government officials and local communities, the Deputy Minister for Community Development, Gender, Women and Special Groups, Mwanaidi Ali Khamis, delivered a strong message: Raising children within a family setup should always be a priority.

In the course, she reminded the audience that the family environment provides the most nurturing space for children, where they receive not only material support but also love, guidance and protection. Yet, she acknowledged that for various reasons, not all children have this luxury.

Raising children in a family setting can, however, help reduce the number of children who grow up in institutional care."

While this call to prioritise family settings was central to the minister's address, she also took the opportunity to thank the Laji Foundation for its ongoing support of children in orphanages.

The donation of school supplies is not just a matter of generosity—it is a crucial step toward empowering children in orphanages to pursue their education and dreams,

The Chairman of Laji Foundation, Intiaz Laji, echoed these sentiments in his speech, stressing the foundation's goal of continuing to support communities in need. He emphasised that access to education is one of the most powerful tools for breaking the cycle of poverty and transforming the lives of young people.

By providing children in orphanages with the school uniforms and supplies they need, the foundation is not just offering material assistance, but is also giving them a critical chance to succeed in school and beyond.

"Access to education and essential resources like school supplies are critical tools in unlocking opportunities for children to achieve their dreams," Intiaz Laji said. "That is why we are committed to providing these children with the support they need to succeed academically and in life."

For the Laji Foundation, this initiative is more than just a one-time event. The organisation has made a long-term commitment to orphanage homes, ensuring that this type of support is provided every year through a sustainable programme that supplies school uniforms, bags, shoes and socks.

This initiative represents not just charity, but a partnership between the community, the government, and organisations like Laji Foundation to improve the lives of children in need.

But why, one might ask, is it so important for institutions and individuals to support children in orphanages? The answer lies in both the practical and emotional needs of these children, many of whom face challenges that children in family settings may not.

Firstly, orphanages often struggle with limited resources, which can make it difficult to provide children with everything they need to thrive.

The minister praised the Laji Foundation for its consistency in supporting education in orphanages, acknowledging that such collaboration between the government and NGOs is essential to ensuring sustainable progress.

But it's not just about providing school supplies. The efforts of caregivers in orphanages were also lauded during the ceremony. Mama Mutemba, speaking on behalf of the caregivers from the nine orphanage centres, expressed heartfelt gratitude to the Laji Foundation.

She highlighted how the donation would help the children attend school without the challenges posed by the lack of basic supplies, which

often deter children from fully engaging in their studies. She also emphasised the need for continued support from all sectors of society, reminding everyone that while progress has been made, there is still much work to be done.

The Laji Foundation's annual support is a perfect example of how a well-structured and sustainable initiative can make a lasting difference in the lives of vulnerable children. Awali Mwenyekiti wa Taasisi hiyo Imtiaz Lalji amesema kuwa kama taasisi wanatoa huduma za msingi kwa watu wenye uhitaji kama hao watoto ambao tumeweza kuwapita vifaa vya shule hivyo tunatarajia watoto hawa

Vilevile tunatoa vifaa kwa mwaka mara mbili mwanzo wa mwaka na mwishoni mwa mwaka katika sehemu zenye uhitaji lengo ni kuweza kupeleka huduma kwa jamii husika ikiwemo watoto walioko kwenye vituo maalumu.
