#### 1. Executive Summary

The **Lalji Foundation** is a non-profit organization dedicated to serving underprivileged communities in Tanzania through targeted and sustainable interventions in the areas of **healthcare**, **education**, **economic empowerment**, **Community Development and orphan support**.

Lalji Foundation, in its commitment to support the health and well-being of vulnerable individuals, partnered with **CCBRT Hospital** to sponsor prosthetics for patients with limb disabilities. This project is a key component of the Foundation's health sector interventions aimed at restoring mobility, dignity, and economic independence to people living with physical impairments.

The foundation sponsored **15 people with prosthetic limbs**, benefiting both children and adults. This report outlines the objectives, beneficiaries, outcomes, and recommendations for enhancing sustainability and impact.

**Fatema Lalji**, the secretary of Lalji Foundation, said, "It brings us immense joy to see children regain their mobility and confidence. Every child deserves the chance to walk, play, and learn without limitation. This partnership with CCBRT reflects our foundation's mission to restore dignity and opportunity through targeted health interventions."

**Dr. Ruth Onesmo** serves as the **Head of the Prosthetics Unit** at CCBRT Hospital in Dar es Salaam. She publicly **thanked the Lalji Foundation** for sponsoring prosthetic and orthotic fittings for 15 patients in July 2025. Her remarks emphasized gratitude and a call for further stakeholder support.

# From crutches to confidence: Why these kids smile

AT the Comprehensive Commanity Based Rehabilitation
(CCBRT) Hospital in Tanzana,
something magical is buppening
at its Day es Salavan location, not
with fairly dust, but with sensee,
compassion and a quiet army of
supporters who profer applainse to
go to the children, not themselves.

In a secent ceremony that looked more like a celebration than a medical event, 15 individuals, many of them children received life-changing prosthetic limbs, taming a new page in their journey toward independence. Some came wheeled in, others camed by hopeful parents, but they all left with renawed dreams and a reason to stand tall, literally.

It is not just about legs. It is about life and this time necesstated by Lelji Foundation a nonpeofit philarthropic organisation founded by the Lelji family in Tanzania. In a nutshell, the founquality of life and fostering inclusive community development.

Among the most moving stoness was fast of Neema Meena, a mother and survivor of domestic violence, who lost her limbs in a total attack. She is not a child, but her journey resources deeply. Neema shared her emotional doubts, revealing how prosthetics would now allow her to work, case for herself and most importantly, serve as a living inspiration to her own children.

"I can now walk again. I can now do business again. I can now feed my family," she said, blinking back tears but smaling with her whole face.

But let us talk about the children. There is nothing quite like geing a child who once crawled or was carried by a parent, now standing up, webbly at first, but beaming with poy. That's what bappens at CCBRT every time someone steps in to support dissubility care. A child who once watched football from the sidelines is now learning to turn. Another is learning to drace. One more can now went shoes for the first time in years. However, the road is not easy, but it is walkable (threadly).

Commenting on this progress, Ruth Onesmo, the head of CCBRT's rehabilitation department, has seen it all. Broken hubs, broken spirits, but also incredible residence.

"When we say disability is not inability, this is exactly what we mean," she said, during the hundover event. "Today, we are giving these children and adults not just assistive himbs, but dignity, freedom and a second chance."

But Ruth also raised a practical issue: access to these services is still far too difficult for many Tanomians, especially those relying on health insurance schemes that don't cover positeties. She proposed an idea that deserves reticual attention and fast is a special insurance package that includes assistive devices, or at least a simplified process for those in used.

"Reducing the cost burden will unlock potential for thousands," she shessed. "You don't know how powerful legs are until you don't have them."

The numbers tell a powerful story. Though 15 people received the stime, the waiting list remans long. Many families simply can't afford prosthetics, even though they are crucial to mobility and inclusion. In rural areas, the situation is even worse. A clidd without a limb is often a child without schooling, without friends and without a future.

That is why CCBRT continues to call on more supporters from companies, individuals and even school furdraisers to step in. Because while one log costs money, the outcome is praceless.

When we talk of the benefits? They are endless. Mobility leads to education Education leads to opportunity. And opportunity leads to independence. For children, a prosthetic limb can mean being able to carry their cwn schoolbag instead of being carried. For leenagers, it might mean joining a local sports team or riching a boyche for the first time. For parents of children with disabilities, it means watching their kids thrive, not just

The upple effect extends beyond the individual to families, communities and the national eccuracy. It is hard to believe that something as simple as a leg can boost accounty's productivity. But it does "Disability is not coungious, but compassons should be"

On her part, Fatenia Lalji, Secretary-General of the Lalji, Foundation, systed that the goal of the donotion is to touch the laves of people with various needs in the community. She also called on stakeholders and Turasmins of lurge to come out in greater numbers to support such initiatives.

This mults the fourth time the Lalji Foundation has donated proschetic limbs to portions in need at CCBRT Hospital, as part of the foundation's tradition of supporting vulnerable individuals.

One couldn't help but notice the overwhelming joy and gratitude in the air during the event Smiles, laughter and the familiar Tanzanian sense of humour were

everywhere.

"Leo tanstembes kwa ncema!" one parent exclaimed and that is "today, we walk by mace!"

Even the hospital staffnamely doctors, physiotherspits and social workers were moved. After all, they don't just read potents here, they walk the journey with frem. From fitting the limbs to teaching potients how to use them, to counseling parents and care-givers, it is a team effort.

#### A culture of giving, not just a one-off event

This was not the first time help came knocking at CCBRT and it won't be the last. The hospital has seen continued support from generous individuals and organisations committed to upliffing lives. In fact, this was the fourth such douation in recent memory. But no one is counting, because the focus is not on the give, but on the gift of transformation.

CCBRT's model of pertuening with local and international denors quietly, without fandare, but with measurem impact is what sets it apart. There are no giant butters or thefung billbourth just real change, one person at a time.

If you're wondering what you can do, the answer is simple: stort small. Visit CCBRT. Volunteer. Donnte a crutch, a shoe, a coin. Or simply spread the word. The child who walks tomorrow could be your neighbour, you student, your own relative. Let's build a society where disability is not a barrier, but a beginning.

Because everyone deserves the right to stand up, walk out the door and those their dreams with or without a cape.
