1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Through this partnership, beneficiaries received high-quality prosthetic devices together with professional assessment, fitting, rehabilitation, and follow-up care provided by the expert team at CCBRT Hospital.

Brenda Msangi, Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of CCBRT Hospital, expressed her sincere appreciation to Lalji Foundation and Baraka Foundation Canada for their generous support in providing prosthetic limbs to individuals living with disabilities. She noted that the donation represents more than just medical assistance it offers hope, restores dignity, and empowers beneficiaries to regain their independence and actively participate in their families and communities.

- To restore dignity and improve the physical, emotional, and socioeconomic well-being of prosthetic beneficiaries and their families.
- To foster collaboration between Lalji Foundation, Baraka Foundation Canada, and CCBRT Hospital in delivering sustainable healthcare interventions that benefit vulnerable communities.
- To increase public awareness of the importance of inclusive healthcare and equal opportunities for people living with disabilities.
- To contribute to the long-term availability of quality prosthetic and rehabilitation services through partnerships with specialized healthcare institutions.

- To improve the lives of beneficiaries by enabling them to become productive, self-reliant, and active members of society, thereby contributing to the overall development of their communities.

7. CHALLENGES IDENTIFIED

- Many patients come from low-income families and are unable to afford the cost of prosthetic limbs, rehabilitation services, transportation, and follow-up appointments. As a result, some remain without mobility assistance for extended periods.
- Educational Barriers - Children and young adults with limb loss may experience interruptions in their education due to mobility challenges, inadequate assistive devices, or inaccessible learning environments.
- Some people living with disabilities are unaware of the availability of prosthetic and rehabilitation services or how to access them.
- Negative attitudes and misconceptions about disability continue to discourage some individuals from seeking treatment or participating fully in community life.

- Meeting the growing demand for prosthetic services requires continued financial support, technical expertise, and strong partnerships to sustain the program.

8. IMPACTS OF THE PROJECT

- The project enabled children and adults with limb loss to regain mobility through the provision of high-quality prosthetic limbs. Beneficiaries are now able to perform daily activities independently and lead more active lives.
- Access to prosthetic devices has restored dignity, confidence, and self-esteem, allowing beneficiaries to participate more fully in family, social, and community life.
- The collaboration ensured that vulnerable individuals received professional prosthetic assessment, fitting, rehabilitation, and follow-up care from CCBRT Hospital, regardless of their financial circumstances.
- Children who received prosthetic limbs have been able to return to school, while adults have regained the ability to work, generate income, and support their families.
- The project raised awareness about the rights and abilities of people living with disabilities, encouraging greater social inclusion and reducing stigma within communities.
- The successful collaboration between Lalji Foundation, Baraka Foundation Canada, and CCBRT Hospital demonstrated the effectiveness of partnerships in delivering sustainable healthcare solutions for vulnerable populations.
